New president readies to lead DACC starting Monday

DANVILLE - Dr. Stephen Nacco will officially take the reins as the seventh president in Danville Area Community College's 70-year history Monday, August 15. Announced as the next president following a special Board of Trustees meeting July 6, he comes to DACC after six years as vice president of administrative services and executive assistant to the president at Union County College in Cranford, N.J.

He and his wife Cindy will officially move to the Danville community on August 14.

"This is a beautiful community college, a bedrock for Danville and the region, and a leader in student



success and workforce development," Nacco said after accepting the president's position in July. "For my wife, Cindy, and me, we're privileged to be invited into this wonderful community."

Since 2010, Nacco has overseen continuing education, the Industry-Business Institute, the Center for Economic & Workforce Development, marketing and communications.

As one of Union's five officers, Nacco assisted the president in managing Union in support of the College mission. His span of responsibilities included labor relations, contract negotiations, hiring, policy-and-regulation development, emergency communications and crisis response, strategic planning, technology and facility planning, review of academic programs, institutional assessment, capital construction, faculty and instructor hiring and tenure, budget development, Middle States accreditation, Board relations, K-12 superintendents, and outreach to elected officials. Further, in his role as executive assistant, Nacco addressed serious student and employee issues on behalf of the president.

Nacco holds a doctorate in educational leadership focused on community colleges from Rowan University, a Ph.D. in English and American literature from Fordham University, a master's in English and American literature from St. John's University and a bachelor's degree in English literature from State University of New York at Plattsburgh.

He will have a full calendar during his first week as he hits the ground running with the all-college inservice. This annual three-day event immediately precedes the opening day of fall semester Monday, August 22. Nacco's first DACC Board of Trustees meeting will be held Tuesday, August 23.

"In following Dr. Jacobs' footsteps," he noted, "I need to work hard to continue the progress DACC has seen, to continue to support regional job growth, student access, and affordability."

Nacco replaces Dr. Alice Marie Jacobs, who retired after 46 years in higher education, the last 17 of which were as DACC president.
