# Hoopeston man held on \$1 million bond in woman's death

A 32-year-old Hoopeston man is being held on \$1 million bond, charged in the shooting death of a Danville woman.

Johnnie L. Sampson Jr. was arrested at about 1 p.m. Monday at his home in the 1200 block of Daisy Lane in connection with the shooting death of Mary Thompson, 30, of Danville.

Ms. Thompson was found inside a vehicle at 9:45 p.m. August 5 at the intersection of Fowler Ave. and Clyman Lane, near Fair Oaks housing complex. Police believe she was shot as she entered the complex.

She was taken to Carle Foundation Hospital where she died at 7:35 p.m. August 6 from a gunshot wound to the head.

Sampson is being held on four counts of first-degree murder, all Class M felonies. If convicted, he could face 20 years in prison.

A warrant for Sampson's arrest was issued August 11. He was arraigned Tuesday, where he pleaded not guilty to the charges through an assistant public defender. A preliminary hearing is set for 1:30 p.m. September 1.

To be released on bond, Sampson would have to post \$100,000.

Danville police were assisted by Hoopeston police, the Vermilion Metropolitan Enforcement Group (V-MEG) and the U.S. marshal's service.

# Firemen replacing old and broken hydrants in Hoopeston

Hoopeston Fire Department is improving Hoopeston's safety and their ability to fight fires.

Firemen are replacing old and broken fire hydrants under comprehensive plan implemented by the city, which allocated \$50,000 this year for the program.

Ald. Bill McElhaney, water/sewer committee chairman, said 11 hydrants are slated to be changed out this year. Five have already been completed.

Earlier this year, firemen tested all hydrants in the city, which McElhanev estimated at about 500. Some were broken while others are 100 years or older, he said.

The age of the hydrants, as well as the water mains, sometimes makes connecting the two tricky, McElhaney said. "In some cases, they're going into an 110-year-old main."

Ald. Carl Ankenbrand, fire committee chairman, thanked the city for the improvement.

In unrelated discussion, Ald. Bill Goodwine disagreed with the perception that the city is not doing anything about the condition of an elderly woman's home in the 700 block of East Lincoln.

Neighboring residents complained about the situation in June and again at the August 2 meeting. At both, residents said emergency personnel who removed the woman from her home wore hazmat suits due to mold. feces and other substances in the house.

The woman, described as a hoarder, in currently in a nursing home and residents would like the house condemned and demolished so she cannot return.

In the meantime, her son has begun cleaning the clutter from the house, which, neighbors said, exposes them to toxins from inside the structure.

Goodwine, who represents that ward, said while neighbors say the city doesn't follow up, "we do."

Questioned about whether the woman actually owns the home, officials began to answer the question.

Goodwine has personally been at the home and talked to the son twice. He reported that the man is on his third big Dumpster of things removed from the home.
