
#### *Elections* continued from other side

• In Ward 4, a four-year term for the seat currently held by Bill Goodwine.

In Grant Township, which serves Hoopeston and surrounding area, all officials are up for reelection for four year terms. Positions include supervisor, currently Megan Deck; Marty Maul's position as road commissioner; multi-township assessor, currently Susie Ward; and Sharon Johnson's position as clerk.

All four trustee seats are also up in April and are currently held by Mike Eckersley, Dave Ervin, Dale Lithgow and Rich Thompson.

Hoopeston Public Library District has three seats, all with six-year terms, open. Seats are currently held by Wayne King, Dale Fry and Janet Crouch.



## Hoopeston Fire Department breaks with 134-year tradition

Hoopeston Fire Department has broken a policy in effect since the department was founded in 1882. For the first time in its history, the department has a female volunteer firefighter.

Maggie Bartley is one of three new firefighters announced at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting. Asked why a woman was chosen, Fire Chief Joel Bird responded, "Why not?

"It's 2016," he said. "Times have changed. When people are volunteering, you have to strike while the iron is hot."

The other newcomers, Nathan Michael and Gino Wagner, are the first hired under the department's new policy of accepting 18-year-old volunteers, which was approved by the council in July.

• Took no action on a request from Military History Museum of Aurora and Illinois Signal Corps to trade the tank from Floral Hill Cemetery. In exchange, the group would trade a cannon or other artifact.
