PUSMC's Body Walk is an interactive experience where each child gets to pretend to be shrunk into a small particle, allowing them to explore the wonders of the human body by journeying past 13 educational booths.

"The Body Walk is a fun, interactive way for kids to explore the human body," said PUSMC's HALO Project Director and Body Walk Co-Chair Kathy Richard. "It's a great tool that motivates students to learn more about how their body works so they know how to make healthy choices when it comes to eating, being active and taking care of their overall health."
