Hoopeston Area board prepares to interview for new super

Hoopeston Area board members will begin their part in selecting a new superintendent early next month.

The board previously approved using Illinois Association of School Boards services - at a cost of \$7,400 to recruit candidates, then winnow the field to four to six applicants who best meet the criteria set by the dis-

Board members received those applicants names at a special meeting Thursday and will meet in closed session November 3-5 to interview them. Second round interviews will be set later this month, with a new school chief expected to be named in November or December.

If a successful candidate is not selected from the first wave, IASB will repeat the process to find a replacement for Supt. Hank Hornbeck, who will retire at the end of this school year.

With that search nearing completion, the board will turn its attention to hiring for new openings, including:

- Using state resources in a search for a new high school guidance counselor to replace Kay Brown who will retire July 1. The opening will be posted in December.
- Also in December, John Greer will begin looking for a student service person as part of the school's transition from serving fifth and sixth graders to third through fifth graders in 2016.

Sixth graders will become part of the middle school population.

In discussing the need for the position, John Greer Principal Dan Walder said the transition team met in September to begin working on the transition. Several areas have been completed, but more work is needed. "An incredible amount of time is going on behind the scenes," he said.

In unrelated business, the board:

- Hired Mara Sutton as Maple special education aide, effective September 26; Jenna Leslie, Maple special ed aide, effective October 11; and Kyle Ramos, eighth grade boys basketball coach, effective October 18.
- Approved volunteers, starting October 18, including Rob Obenland, Gordon Allen, Jon Layden, Mary Bushong and Marissa Obenland with the FFA program and Darin Tate with the middle school boys basketball
- Approved continued participation in the D.A.R.E. program at a cost not exceed \$3,388.
- Approved administrator and teacher salaries for fiscal year 2016.
- Learned the Music Boosters will hold a fundraiser on November 12, featuring a silent auction and carnival
- Band director Patrick Brooks said the first payment to participate in the bowl game has been made and that band participants are selling Little Debbie products ad a fundraiser now.
- Learned Maple School will hold Family Fun Monster Bash Night on November 3.
- Heard that Honeywell School teachers began their Monster Walk fundraiser on October 14 and that students will begin theirs on October 28 to see which group can raise more funds to be used to buy tables to use with Chromebooks, replacing existing desks.
- Learned that Lt. Col Lizabeth M. Wenzel will be the featured speaker at the November 11 Community Veterans Day assembly at the school. She is a professor of aerospace studies and commander of Air Force ROTC Detachment 415 at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities.


