Hoopeston Public Library to take food, goods in lieu of fines

Hoopeston Public Library is offering its annual holiday "gift" to the community that will also support the Grant Township Food Cupboard.

From December 1-30 only, library patrons can pay their overdue fines with canned food or other nonperishable items, which will be donated to food cupboard.

For each item brought in, the patron will receive \$1 off their library fine. "Food for Fines" is good only to pay fines, and cannot be used to pay for lost materials or other fees. Patrons will not receive change or credit if their fine is less than a whole dollar amount. For

example, to pay all of a \$2.50 fine, they must bring in three items.
