New proposal would cut golf cart exam, hike cart permit fee

A measure proposed at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting would be a mixed bag for golf cart

Ald. Brandon Hamilton, police committee chairman, is proposing saving golf cart owners the cost of an annual inspection while raising the fee for the privilege of driving a golf cart in town.

Hamilton is recommending the city do away with the third-party inspection and provide a checklist to golf cart owners who would then be responsible for making sure their carts meet city requirements.

The checklist will be available at city hall.

He also plans to ask the council to increase the golf cart fee from \$30 per year to \$50. Since carts are allowed to

be driven in the city throughout the year, "that's still less than \$5 a month," he said.

In other action, the council approved the annual tax levy of \$734,000, up from \$707,000 last year.

The levy - the amount of property tax collected for city use - is up 3.81 percent over last year because the city's equalized assessed valuation (EAV) rose from \$25,890 to \$26,835,000, said Ald. Bill Goodwine, finance committee chairman.



Nearly half of the increase will go for increased police pension costs, which are going up by \$11,000, Goodwine said.

In unrelated business, the council:

• Approved, in a 5-1 vote, a subdivision variance for Prairie Meadows II.

Although Ald. Bill McElhaney said engineers signed off on the variance, Goodwine voted against it saying he didn't think a variance granted 6.5 years ago for a different project (Prairie Meadows I) in a different location should be used for the new project.

Aldermen Carl Ankenbrand and Ryan Anderson

- Approved Gail Lane to assume the duties of municipal clerk Greg Lane when he is absent.
- Heard from Ald. Chad Yaden that bids for repairing the damaged pillar at Floral Hill Cemetery have been turned over to the city's insurance company.
