Rebuilding America's workforce

We have heard of plans to put this nation's middle class back to work in jobs that will enable our workforce to be able to support their families. These are good hopes and wishes.

Unlike the era of FDR, when a lot of sweat and a strong back built some of our roads and infrastructures under the WPA and other government programs, today the work force needed is a skilled work force. There are 10 industries that, in the next decade, will be short of qualified, skilled workers to fill the openings that will be available:

Health care: We already know their will be a shortage of doctors, because there is a shortage this very day. In the next decade there, will be a shortage of 103,900 nurses to fill hospital jobs, and 7,800 physical therapists.

Energy: There will be 40% of the employees that supply your energy retiring (it has already begun).

Mining, oil, gas and extraction: The demand will

be increasing.

Technology: There will be 34% more software programmers, and 20% more system analysts needed.

Engineering: There will be a shortage of 88% of skilled workers.

Biotech: There won't be enough technicians to staff our labs.

Sales: The often forgotten salesmen that create the needed demand for products will have a 72% short-

Manufacturing: Because so much of industry has evolved, employees needed will have to run and repair machines and robots.

Child care: There will be a shortage of 532,100 new skilled child care people in the next decade.

Construction: There is a 68% shortage of carpenters, plumbers, electricians, welders, and other skilled builders in this nation right now.

What does all this mean?

For this nation to be able to fill all these jobs plus

those not mentioned, there is going to have to be a lot of training done.

For the most part, these jobs cannot be taught just out of a book; on the job training will be necessary. Most employers cannot afford to hire people that are not skilled (they cannot train them).

So, it looks to me like our government needs some sort of a program to help train the people that are going to be needed to fill these jobs, and insure that this nation's economy and the middle class workers are in
