Hoopeston Area officials notified of end of tri-party deal

After several years of being courted by two suitors, Rossville-Alvin school officials have notified Hoopeston Area that the relationship is over.

At Thursday's board meeting, Supt. Hank Hornbeck read a letter from the Rossville-Alvin board, stating that Rossville-Alvin is proceeding with putting the question of a cooperative high school before voters in April and notifying Hoopeston Area that they would not be renewing the tri-party agreement.

The agreement, among Rossville-Alvin, Hoopeston Area and Bismarck-Henning districts, concerns Rossville-Alvin high school students who, since their own school was deactivated in 2004, have been able to choose to attend one of the other two schools.

In April, Rossville-Alvin and Bismarck-Henning voters will decide whether their schools should form a cooperative high school. If approved, the co-op high school would be a separate district, having its own budget and school board made up of three members each from Rossville and Bismarck. A seventh member would serve as board president. The agreement would be for 20 years, unless Rossville-Alvin consolidates with another district.

Hoopeston Area's board had no comment after the letter was read.
