

TRIO support service to be offered at DACC-Hoopeston site

A new support service will be offered at the DACC Higher Learning Center - Hoopeston.

TRIO Student Support Services is a federally-funded program offered by the U.S. Dept. of Education. Available at DACC, it was made available last month at DACC- Hoopeston.

Karla Coon, Higher Learning Center director, talked about TRIO services at Thursday's Hoopeston Area School Board meeting.

TRIO is not designed for high school students, but is for first-generation college students (those whose parents have not earned bachelor's degrees); have financial need, have a documented learning or physical disability; or be a U.S. citizen or have documented permanent residency

TRIO participants receive several academic interventions, including annual assessment and annual individual academic service plan; academic and career advising; transfer advising to four-year colleges and universities; professional academic tutoring; and others.

To participate, those who meet eligibility requirements need to fill out the TRIO interest application. Those who meet the requirements will then complete the new student

application. Assistance in filling out both applications is available.

Once enrolled, students have a "one stop support person" for academic support and assistance with financial aid issues, Coon said.

Local students will have contact with their TRIO advisors in person and via teleconference, she said.

While high school students are not eligible, Coon wants to make them aware of the service so that they may take advantage of it at some point or others in their family may take advantage of the program.

By helping students in academic, financial and social areas, TRIO helps students succeed. Those who use the program's services have a higher retention rate, she said.

In other DACC - Hoopeston news, Coon said a new tutoring program is going well. "We wanted to start small and we did," she said, saying two students took advantage of the service this semester. The small size allowed staff to evaluate the program for strengths and weaknesses for future semesters. "We're pleased with how it's going," she said.

Enrollment at the center is satisfactory but officials are looking at program diversity to draw more students in, such as conversational Japanese, she said.
