Several business closings took place or were announced, the closing of a landmark was decided and the area lost community leaders

and friends in 2016.

Economic conditions resulted in the closing of two businesses this vear: Cellular One's September closing was announced in July, while Joyce's Then Now & Beyond, which opened in November 2015, closed in October.

Two other business closings were announced but have not yet happened. Shopko officials announced in November that its Hoopeston store will close in January 2017 and last week it was announced that Hoopeston Pizza Hut will close December 31. Rod's Home and Auto stopped

> alderman and civic leader Randy Carter on September 9 and longtime Rossville and Hoopeston businesswoman, Molly Culbert on September 23.


> October saw the passing of Carol Flint, who made her mark as Grant Township supervisor and former first lady of Hoopeston, on October 18.



owner of Milford Family Restaurant, Jesus "Jesse" Cintora was shot after going to the restaurant in response to a burglar alarm.

Nineteen-year-old Randy White, of Milford, was charged with first degree murder in connection with Mr. Cintora's death. White has pleaded not guilty and remains in jail in lieu of \$1 million bond.

Some major stories from this year will continue into 2017. One is the issue of police dispatching in Hoopeston.

After serving as a backup dispatching center for Vermilion County for decades, Hoopeston stopped that function in September after being told 911 answering centers in Illinois were consolidating.

Since then, dispatchers, p0olice officers, firemen and residents have urged the council to reinstate dispatching.

City and county officials are currently working out the details that will be necessary to return dispatching duties.



Another story that will be decided in the new year is who will head the Hoopeston Area School District when Hank Hornbeck retires next year.

District officials used the Illinois Association of School Boards to search for qualified candidates. The school board interviewed four candidates but did not come to agreement on any of them.

A second search was started; applications for that search will close January 20, 2017.

Another story on the radar for the new year include work to fix the flooding problem on Hoopeston's northeast side. After studies of sewer lines in the
