Watseka hospital plans to close obstetrics service in July '17

WATSEKA—In its entire 101year history, Iroquois Memorial Hospital has been a place where generations of women have given birth.

That tradition is expected to end this year.

Hospital officials announced last week that they plan to file a certificate of need with the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board to close the obstetrics services unit effective July 31.

According to a statement issued by the hospital, the difficult decision was made after years of demands of maintaining an obstetrics program.

IMH has one birth every four days, according to the statement. Over the past three years, IMH has lost more than \$2.5 million just in OB, said Jim McRoberts, hospital marketing director.. Last year's loss in the department was just under \$875,000.

In recent years, more than 300 rural hospitals across the country have closed their OB departments, McRoberts said.

Currently, 11 nurses serve the OB department. They will be offered the opportunity to move into open positions. Plans are also being made to recognize and honor physicians, nurses and those who began their life's journey at IMH.

Going forward, officials continue to focus on providing the very best primary care to patients in the
