Fake news to be topic of HPL panel discussion on Tuesday

Fake news: it's the buzzword of the year, and a reason why many people are frustrated with the media. But a free press is one of the cornerstones of American democracy, and it's important citizens stay informed. So how do you find the truth in an age of information overload?

Hoopeston Public Library will hold a program that might help, "Fake News: Cutting through the Clutter to Find the Facts", at 6 p.m., Tuesday.

A panel discussion will feature three area journalists: Jordan Crook, reporter/editor of the Hoopeston Chronicle; Mary Wicoff, of the Danville Commercial-News; and Pam Dempsey, executive director of the Midwest Center for Investigative Reporting, an online, independent newsroom based in Champaign-Urbana.

The program will focus on the role of the press in a free society and how news gathering and reporting has changed over the years.
