Residents' experience used to teach upcoming HLC classes

Local people are using their experience and skills to teach upcoming classes at Hoopeston's DACC Higher Learning Center. Those classes and a few facts about their instructors include:

Creative Nonfiction Writing

Nonfiction writing is about real people, places, things, and events. Readers flock to it. In fact, nonfiction is more popular than fiction.

Nonfiction writing offers insights into aspects of life that people may otherwise never experience. From humor to drama, the practical to the pleasurable, personal profiles to essays on the meaning of life, non-fiction runs the gamut, the range of writing limited only to the au-

thor's curiosity and research.

In this class, instructor Mike Pemberton will touch on four major forms of creative non-fiction: memoir, personal essay, feature articles, and profiles. Students will read examples of each, then create their own pieces.

The only requirements are to read, write, share experiences and discover the unique voice that resides in every writer.

Pemberton has a Masters in Creative Writing from Illinois State University. His short stories, essays, and excerpts from novels have appeared in such literary journals as Euphemism, Touchstone, Aethlon, Sport Literate,
