Totheroh touches on personal, national in keynote speech

A recent personal experience provided a new take on an old tradition for Monday's keynote speaker at Hoopeston's Memorial Day service.

On March 1, Beth Totheroh's father, Gary Gillens, died. At his burial, as Totheroh looked on, the honor guard performed the 21-gun salute for her dad. In Monday's speech, she called what that act "significant."

Totheroh outlined the history of Memorial Day. "It's an old holiday," she said. Although loved ones have decorated graves for years, Decoration Day - a day set aside to remember those who died in military service to their country - was started in 1868.

"It was not created for backyard barbeques or to kick off the summer season," Totheroh said. Instead, it is a day to pay "honor and homage to those who gave their lives for freedom."

The willingness of the Armed Forces to serve has "earned our eternal gratitude," said Totheroh, calling America "absolutely the best country in the world."

No matter what one's political inclinations are, "we're obligated to join forces and honor those who have served." Veterans and those currently serving deserve respect, attention and gratitude, she added.

While honoring the "sacrificial service" of those who gave all. Totheroh said everyone needs to identify how he or she can personally serve the country and community, urging all to "be strong and courageous."

She ended her speech quoting John F. Kennedy's 1961 inaugural address: "whether you are citizens of America or citizens of the world, ask of us here the same high standards of strength and sacrifice which we ask of you.
