Hoaks twins indicted in Oklahoma

Former Hoopeston twins Birdie Jo and Becky Jo Hoaks are wanted in Oklahoma, accused of writing bad check to pay for thousands of dollars of stamps.

According to printed reports, the Hoaks twins, 47, of Choctaw, Okla., stole more than \$14,000 worth of postage stamps by writing bad checks. They are also accused of opening several checking accounts at different banks.

Officials allege the twins would open a checking account, making several small deposits of \$5 to \$200. They would then go to post offices in Oklahoma to buy the stamps, knowing the checks would not clear.

The pair were indicted by a federal grand jury in the Western District of Oklahoma for nine fraudulent purchases in Oklahoma City, El Reno, Hinton, Moore, Duncan, Tecumseh, Shawnee and Asher.

In their younger years, the androgynous-looking twins would pose as boys to obtain food, clothing and housing from churches and other agencies. When their gender was discovered, the Hoakses would leave whatever town they were in..

The Hoaks twins have been investigated for previous scams and cons in Vermont, Texas, New York, Maine, Kansas, Arkansas, South Dakota, Utah **hooplib.org**. Children can also be registered on kickoff day or any time during the six weeks of the program. For more information, call or stop by the library, 110 N.
