Matta out after 13 years as Buckeye head basketball coach

The 13-year reign of Hoopeston son Thad Matta as Ohio State's head basketball coach is over.

At a press conference Monday, athletic director Gene Smith. with Matta seated next to him, announced that the Buckeye program is in search of a new leader.

The winningest coach in Buckeye basketball history had hit a rough patch the past couple of years: on the hardwood, (17-15 last season), in his health and in recruiting efforts - where negative recruiting by other teams, including rumors of Matta's imminent death - caused potential players to sign elsewhere.

Matta was sometimes tearful, sometimes philosophical, sometimes cracking jokes but always humble during Monday's announcement. Calling the past 13 years "the best of my life," Matta thanked Smith for his support over the years, the coaches who served under him, doctors who helped him continue to coach and the players. "We had some good ones," he said.

Smith said he made the decision after a meeting with Matta on Friday, where the men discussed the basketball program and Matta's role in it. Saying there was nothing leading up to Monday's meeting, talking to Matta on Monday, Smith said "it happened in the moment" and he felt "it was time" for a leadership change to "get our program back to where (Matta) built it."

Asked if his health contributed to less success recently, Matta said coaching exacerbated his back problems but

refused to use his condition as a crutch. "We had our heyday when I was in this situation," he said.

Matta said he has had four major back surgeries in his life, the first at age 15. A surgery in June 2007 left him with no feeling in his right foot, chronic back pain and balance problems. Afterwards, he spent a year not being able to walk or take off his shoes.

Asked if he thought he would still be the coach if his health were better, he replied "Yeah, probably."

Known as a "hopalong guy" before he came to Ohio State.

Matta said he was known for going from place to place but that he and his family put down roots in the Ohio State community. To help that community, he offered to help the team and his successor...maybe. "Let me get this straight. If the guy comes in and does great, I was involved. If he doesn't, I had nothing to do with it," he said, a smile on his face.

Asked about another coaching job, "never say never," Matta said, but stressed his focus now is "to try to get healthy...just trying to get my body to where I can be serviceable."

Matta told himself "today does not define who I am" as he mentally reviewed his successes, which include two Final Four appearances in 2007 and 2012, three NCAA Elite Eight appearances and five Sweet 26 trips, 10 NBA draft picks, and a record 337 Buckeye wins, 216 at home,

ranking them #1 nationally since 2005.

It also includes helping a string of players do better not just on the court, but also in life. A 20 percent graduation rate among players when he started in 2004-05, is currently at 88 percent, he said.

Despite an impressive scorecard, Matta hopes his legacy focuses on something else. "I hope I'm remembered as a really good person who cared about the university, a guy who cared about the players," as well as "we always did it the right way."

Matta still has three years left on a six-year contract, worth more than \$3.2 million annually. Signed in 2013, the deal extends until July 2019. Smith said the contract will be honored and that the details of the buyout are being worked out.

A nationwide search for Matta's replacement is underway.
