**October 19 - FIT WITS: Fostering Improved Thinking While Incorporating Training Strategies** Attendees can learn more about the aging brain and how to keep the brain healthy and engaged.

**October 26 - Head Strong: Exercise Strategies to Enhance Memory and Thinking** Learn about memory and aging and explore several exercise strategies to enhance thinking.
