Hoopeston Area school enrollment drops by 46 for 2017-18

Hoopeston Area's six-day enrollment - the figure traditionally used to determine state aid - shows a loss of 46 students from last year.

The figure was announced at Thursday's Hoopeston Area School Board meeting.

The district has a total 1,186 students. The totals for some grade levels rose. For example, the district has 108 eighth graders, this year, up from 83 last year. But other classes saw fewer students. This year's 75 second grade class is smaller than last year's 91 members.

Figures do not include Rossville-Alvin High School students attending HAHS or pre-K students. At 23 and 20, respectively, those numbers are also less than the 31 and 27 last year.

In the last decade, Hoopeston Area enrollment has declined by 113, a reflection of Hoopeston's population, which dropped from 5,716 in 2006 to 5,140 last year.

- Approved transferring Romig from half stipend middle school Scholastic Bowl sponsor to full stipend sponsor and Megan Weeks from half stipend yearbook sponsor to full stipend sponsor.
- Approved district administrator salaries; salaries for Tim Hillard, Mark Eighner, Rodney Comstock and Curt Spar: and a 42¢/per hour increase for noncertified at-will employees for the current school year.

Hoopeston Area High School will mark Homecoming week starting Monday and leading up to Friday's football game against Clifton Central.


