Legion seeking donations for local Wreaths across America

Hoopeston American Legion volunteers are working to make sure all Vermilion County veterans buried in Danville National Cemetery will have wreaths on their graves this Christmas.

Of the cemetery's more than 11,000 plots, last year, only 2,600 were covered, said Yolanda Yazzie who is coordinating the local effort. "We're working towards everyone getting a wreath," she said.

Donations of any amount are accepted and may be dropped off or mailed to Hoopeston American Legion Post #384, 502 E. Penn St., Hoopeston IL 60942. The Legion is open Wednesdays-Saturdays starting at 3:30 p.m. Donations will be collected until November 3.

Nationwide, wreaths will be placed on graves in national cemeteries on December 16. Danville's ceremony will be synchronized with those across the country and will begin at 11 a.m.

Anyone wishing to help is welcome to do so. The time of placement will be posted at a later date.

For those who would like to honor a deceased veteran not buried in the national cemetery, wreaths may be purchased for \$15 each and may be ordered at the Legion. Wreath deliver will be announced at a later

date. Buyers must pick up and place the wreaths.

Wreaths across America was born when, in 1992, Morril Worcester of Worcester Wreath Company in Harrington, Mass., had a number of extra wreaths at the end of the holiday season. Remembering a trip to Arlington National Cemetery, he donated 5,000 wreaths to be placed at the headstones of an older section of the cemetery. What began as one man's gesture has grown into a national movement.

County officials announce 2nd positive report for West Nile

A dead crow collected September 18 on Danville's north side has tested positive for West Nile Virus.

The positive is the second one this year. In August, a mosquito on Hoopeston tested positive for the disease.

Vermilion County Health Department received calls about 10 dead birds so far this year. Of those, two were collected and found suitable for testing. All birds collected are submitted to the University of Illinois School of Veterinary Medicine laboratory for WNV testing.

The virus can be transmitted to people by the Culex mosquito, if the mosquito has bitten an infected bird.

Symptoms of WNV include fever, body aches, joint pains, headaches, vomiting, diarrhea or a rash, and can last up to several weeks. According to the Centers for Disease Control, only one in five people infected with the virus develop symptoms and less than one percent of them develop severe or fatal neurological illness.

The Illinois Department of Public Health reported that there were 155 human cases of West Nile Virus in the
