From the Blotter

A 16-year-old Hoopeston boy was arrested after police were called at 11:02 a.m. Thursday to Teasdale Foods, 215 W. Washington, regarding several vehicles that were broken into. An owner of one of the vehicles detained the boy until police arrived.

The youth was taken to the police station, where he allegedly damaged a wall.

He was charged with burglary to auto and criminal damage to state-supported property and was taken to the juvenile detention center in Danville to await arraignment.

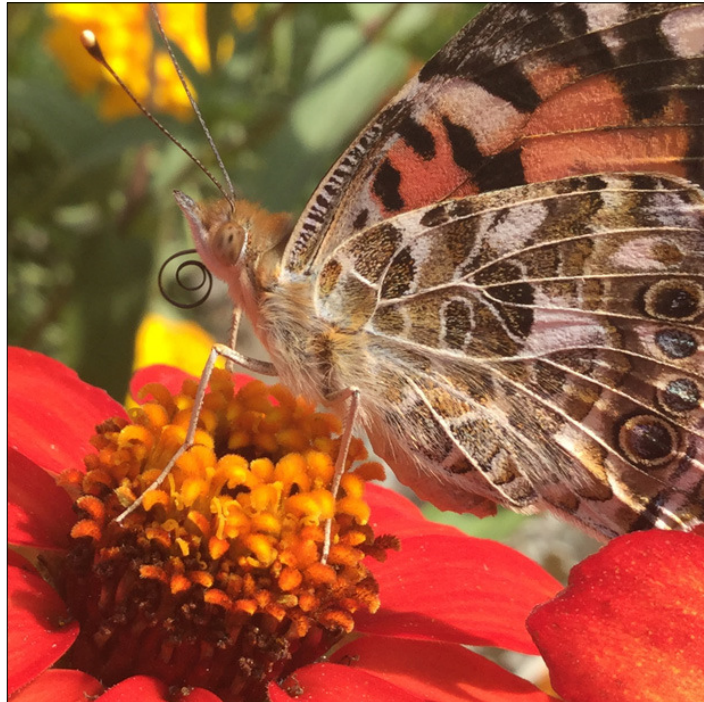

G-RF Buffaloes stand strong, hold Cornjerkers scoreless

The Cornjerkers dropped to 1-6 after a 30-0 loss to Georgetown-Ridge Farm Friday night.

Playing on the road, the Hoopeston Area/Schlarman Academy/Armstrong Potomac coop team had only 17 yards rushing and 143 yard receiving.

Jacob Selsor led rushing with 21, followed by Adam Colunga with 5 and Vaughn Black with 2. In the red were Marcus Blurton -5 and Brad Bradley and Jacob Catron, each with -3.

Catron had six receptions on the night for 57 yards, while Vaughn Black had 3 for 66 yards. Jared Kel-

logg rounded receptions with 4 for 20.

Blurton was 12 of 20 passing for 145 yards.

Senior Nathan Fier led tackles with 5 solos, followed by Catron and Colunga each with 4 solo tackles; Catron had 1 assist and Colunga had 7. Alex Riddle had 3 solo and 12 assists.

Kellogg and Selsor each had one fumble. Kellogg redeemed his with a four-yard interception return.

The team will host Westville Friday at Schlarman Academy in Danville. Regular season play ends October 20 when HA/SA/AP hosts Milford.
