171-foot long side-wheeler (paddle wheels on each side) steamship. Each paddle wheel was 28 feet tall. It's top speed was 5 mph.

In September 1856, the Arabia was carrying 220 tons of cargo, 130 men, women and children plus crew, heading west on the Missouri River when a fallen walnut tree in the river pierced her hull and she sank. The Arabia did not sink quickly and all passengers were able to escape using only a lone rowboat to get them all off.

The only casualty, according to Bodecker, was a mule who was tied to a piece of sawmill equipment See DAR on other side

on the deck and forgotten in chaos that followed.

Over time, the Missouri changed course by a half a mile, losing the exact location of the Arabia. David Hawley located the wreck in July of 1987 using a metal detector. The steamboat was 45 feet under a Kansas farm field.

Hawley, his father Bob, brother Greg and friends Jerry Mackey and David Luttrell spent the next 20 years excavating the Arabia, which still housed the largest collection of pre-Civil War artifacts in the world.

Today, the Arabia Steamboat Museum, which opened in November 1991, displays the artifacts found on the Arabia, including the 10-ton stern of the Arabia. Well over 4,000 items are on display, according to Bodecker.

The museum is located at 400 Grand Blvd, Kansas City, Mo.,
