

Illinois marks Winter Weather Preparedness Week with tips

To help Illinoisans prepare for the coming winter, November 12-18 is declared Winter Weather Preparedness Week.

Winter preparation covers many areas, including home, travel, being outdoors and pet safety. Officials offer the following tips:

Winter travel

• Make sure your vehicle is winter-ready. Check tires, battery, brakes, heating and defrosting system and fluid levels.

• In icy or snowy conditions, adjust roadway speed and distance accordingly. Check road reports before you go.

• If winter weather is expected to hit any part of your travel route, ask yourself if the trip is a matter of life or death. If the answer is no, don't go.

• If you must travel, make sure your gas tank is full. Carry a windshield scraper, jumper cables, small shovel, cell phone, blanket, and an emergency supply kit including non-perishable food and can opener, bottled water, first aid kit, prescription medication, hygiene items, battery operated radio, spare batteries, flashlight, extra clothing and cash.

• If you become stranded, call someone to let them know. Attach a cloth to the car antenna to indicate you need help and turn on the dome light and flashers to make your vehicle more noticeable. Stay in your vehicle.

• Place space heaters at least 3 feet from combustible items.

• Install and maintain carbon monoxide and smoke detectors.

• Never light a grill or wood burner in your home.

• Make sure portable generators are properly ventilated. **Outdoor activities**

• Cold temperatures and windy conditions combine to create wind chill values, temperatures and times at which frostbite will occur.

• If you must be outdoors, be aware of the wind chill, dress in layers and be alert for signs of hypothermia, which include dizziness, numbness, confusion and impaired vision. Seek medical help if you experience these symptoms.

• Know your limits when doing strenuous activities like shoveling snow. Wear layers of clothing but avoid materials like denim, which can become wet and frozen easily.

Pets

• Make sure outdoor pets have shelter from wind, warm bedding material and sufficient food and water.

• In severe weather situations, consider bringing your pets inside.
