Food for Fines

Hoopeston Public Library is holding its annual Food for Fines program through December 30.

Patrons can pay overdue fines with canned food or other non-perishable items which will be donated to the food pantry.

Each item counts as \$1 off a patron's fine. Food for Fines is good only to pay fines, and cannot be used to pay for lost materials or other fees. Patrons will not receive change or credit if their fine is less than a whole dollar amount. For example, to pay all of a \$2.50 fine, they must bring in three items.

Items should not be past their expiration date, should be in their original package, clean and not damaged. Some single-serve items may not qualify.
