Lack of quorum quashes action; chief interviews being held

With four members present, Hoopston City Council was unable to conduct business Tuesday night due to lack of a quorum. Lacking a fifth, the group could not even appoint a mayor pro tempore to lead the gathering.

During the abbreviated session, discussion included: Ald. Brandon Hamilton announcing that interviews have been held to hire a permanent police chief. A couple of interviews have been conducted, he said, but a new chief has not been decided upon.

Ald. Lourdine Florek reported that water department workers have been busy with main breaks, frozen meters and frozen water lines in the wake of recent cold temperatures.

In related discussion, engineer Sam Cole, of C2 Engineering, said water lines have been installed at Prairie Meadows 2.

Other officials attending the meeting were aldermen Chad Yaden and Bill Goodwine and clerk Gail Lane.

Hoopeston wins over Armstrong in march to county crown

Graham Eighner's three 3-point shots helped lead him to the highest-scoring Cornjerker in Tuesday's matchup with Armstrong-Potomac in the Vermilion County Tournament.

The 6' junior contributed 14 points to Hoopeston Area's 47-38 win over the Trojans at the David S. Palmer Arena.

Joining him with three points were teammates Ryan Drayer with one on five attempts, and Brayden Bouse who was 1-1.

Turnovers and steals made the difference as the Trojans had more than three times the turnovers - 16, compared to 5 for Hoopeston Area and three steals, compared to Hoopeston Area's 8. In steals, Logan Walder and Drayer led with 3, with Lucas Hofer and Bouse each adding 1.

The Cornjerkers had 24 rebounds during the game, with Drayer and Hofer leading with 7; Walder with 4, Eighner 3, Bouse 2 and Nate Fier 1.

Walder led HA with 3 assists, followed by Drayer, Hofer and Bouse with 2 each and Eighner and Root with 1 each.

In other action Tuesday night, top seed Bismarck-Henning/Rossville-Alvin, making their debut in the tourney, defeated Westville, 44-30 in the final game of the night.

In the first game of the evening, Salt Fork defeated Georgetown-Ridge Farm, 57-33.

The Cornjerkers will face Salt Fork Thursday night at 8. Other games include Armstrong-Potomac and Georgetown-Ridge Farm at 5 and Bismarck-Henning/Rossville-Alvin at 6:30 p.m.
