

Council gets good news on sewer project, hears PM2 update

Engineer Sam Cole of C2 Engineering brought good news to Tuesday night's Hoopeston City Council meet-

The EPA has indicated the Hoopeston will receive funding for the sanitary sewer lining project planned for Sixth St. between Thompson and McCracken. "Basically, the project is approved," Cole said, but funding is not expected to be approved until July.

The downside is that with late funding, construction will also be delayed, until fall or possibly winter, he said.

Hoopeston also qualifies for a lower tier interest rate, less than the usual interest rate charged on EPA loans. The current rate is 1.76 percent, with the lower tier rate at 1 percent. Rates could increase between now and July, Cole said, but the increase would not be great.

Hoopeston may also qualify for principal forgiveness of as much as 45 percent, he added.

For the city's water tower improvements, the EPA allowed 30 percent principal forgiveness on the \$2.3 million

Officials hope to receive a low interest loan not to exceed \$710,000 for the project, which will include placing inserts in sanitary sewers, sealing joints and manhole work to keep storm water out of the system.

The project has also been given a categorical exclusion because the small scope of the project means construction

will not cause environmental issues.

Cole also reported on progress at Prairie Meadows II, saying water mains have been installed and tested, sewer lines have been installed and sanitary sewers have also been installed and are waiting to be tested. Pavement construction, including sidewalks and streets, is expected to begin in late February.

Water Superintendent Steve Baker reported a new pup was installed at the lift station at the former Baer's Trailer Park and is working well.

In other discussion, Ald. Bill Goodwine recapped a meeting of tax increment financing (TIF) taxing bodies held January 31. At that meeting, Goodwine reviewed TIF expenses and income and Russ Leigh, representing



Youngsters, parents from around Illinois come to Fast Lanes for Pepsi Youth Bowling event

Kids between the ages of six and not-yet-14 thronged to Fast Lanes Bowling Alley in Hoopeston for the two-day Pepsi Youth Bowling competition.

On January 27-28, 152 youngsters and their parents met at Fast Lanes for the event, said Doug Wagoner, Fast Lanes owner.

Bowlers came from Peoria, Kankakee, Monee, Taylorville, Springfield, Mattoon, Shelbyville and other places to test their skills against their peers.

While most bowlers attended one of the two days, one young hopeful made an appearance both days.

Wagoner said the eight-year-old and his mother came from Effingham to bowl in the tournament. When the lad didn't recognize anyone else, he refused to bowl. He and his mother left and she called later to see if an opening was available Sunday. Another bowler canceled with the flu so mother and son returned to Hoopeston. The young man did well and moved on to the next round of competition, Wagoner said.

Those who came for the event were impressed with the alley and the food served by The Pit Stop, the bowling alley's restaurant. "they loved the food, and without our great help, it would not be possible," Wagoner said.

Family, friends, local bowlers and parents of

Hoopeston youth bowlers turned out both days to lend a hand.

To accommodate the tournament, Wagoner had to change the usual schedule, being open on Sunday and serving food more hours than usual. That benefited not only visitors but residents as well, especially Sunday when many people went to Fast Lanes after church. Residents shouldn't get their hopes up for regular Sunday dining there, though. Wagoner said employees, while willing to work a special event, don't want to do so routinely.
