Charlie Warner said each block had a volunteer block captain whose job it was to upgrade the block. All blocks were composed of families with similar low incomes and high unemployment.

"Blocks that were neat and orderly reflected a captain who took the responsibility seriously, Warner said. "The next block might be trashed. That captain did not care. I think each block reflected an attitude more than it reflected money. It reflected that pride and attitude mirrored the leadership of just one person, namely the block captain."

Hoopeston Area students, 24 in all, are going to again participate in a program called Servant Work Tour. They will join 250 other young people from around the country and accomplish 50 needed projects in the Savannah area. During the week they will do such things as scrape and paint houses in poverty stricken areas, work in soup kitchens, help run a day care for underprivileged children, etc.

In the evenings, they gather in spiritual and social activities that are only possible with so many young people celebrating together. At night they sleep on a schoolroom floor.

"Please come join us for our Jambalaya Dinner," invited JJ Mendez. If I'm lucky, I might get you at one of my tables!"
