Request to close part of Lincoln goes to plan commission

A request from Teasdale Foods to close Lincoln St. from First Ave. to the railroad tracks is being sent to the city's planning and zoning committee.

The Hoopeston City Council approved the action, 7-0, at its meeting Tuesday evening. Ald. Bill McElhaney was

Last October, Mayor Bill Crusinberry announced that Teasdale made the request, which would allow the company to connect its buildings on each side of the street. He referred the issue to the city finance committee to meet with plant manager Mel Lollar.

Reasons cited for the request include safety, as workers drive forklifts from one Teasdale building to another, said Ald. Ryan Anderson, city street/alley chairman.

Also, more employees have been hired and if the plan is approved, it will provide more parking for the new hires.

Teasdale business has increased and if the closing is approved, a loading dock will be built to handle truck traffic.

A letter Teasdale sent to residents in the area generated no negative comments on the plan, Crusinberry said.

In other business, Anderson announced that the rail bed alley behind Silgan Containers will be closed to through traffic beginning April 1. A guardrail will be installed to keep semis from the alley; traffic will be directed to Silgan's west parking lot.

The change game after a resident on the west side of Silgan complained about traffic speeding and causing problems.

The council, in a 7-0 vote, approved a seven-year service agreement with Martin Equipment at \$4,464 per year. About the only things not covered are tires, batteries, cutting edges and the like, Anderson said. Martin employees will make will perform onsite oil changes and routine maintenance on the city's new end loader.

In unrelated discussion, Ald, Chad Yaden announced the city is seeking bids for the planting of perpetual care urns and pots. Bids will be opened at 10 a.m. April 3.


