HA board tables two coach resignations, approves two others

Two coaches got a temporary reprieve on their resignations after nearly 50 people - including students, parents and fellow teachers - spoke on their behalf at Thursday's Hoopeston Area School Board meeting.

Matt Colston, Hoopeston Area boys basketball coach, volleyball coach Samantha Pugh, cheerleading coach Lindsey Childress-Bryll, and athletic director Michl Kearney all submitted resignations from their athleticrelated duties, which were on the agenda to be accepted at Thursday's meeting.

The board tabled accepting Colston's and Pugh's resignations after several athletes, parents and staff spoke in their favor.

Ginger Gonzalez, a personal aide in the district, kicked off comments, saving she loves her job but that recent activity has her questioning who to trust. Some people are doing things "they know aren't right. Saying the situation was a "hot mess," she said clear guidelines needed to be established and wished for "a reset button."

Pugh spoke on Colston's behalf, saying she did not like him at first but changed her mind after working with him. Colston's motto, she said, is "if you expect greatness, you'll get greatness," adding Colston pushes his student athletes to achieve that greatness.

Pugh said former local minister Micah Mobley told her that "mediocrity is acceptable in Hoopeston" but that "Matt is not ok with being mediocre."

Bill Crose, the father of two sons who played basketball under Colston's tutelage, "was here for the dark age" when the Cornjerkers were not winning. He related that once, Colston was in Rossville on his way to Danville, when one of Crose's sons called the coach to see about getting in some court time, as it was the only time the boy had free. Colston returned to Hoopeston so the athlete could practice. "I knew the mindset had changed," Crose

Among Colston's alleged infractions are pushing athletes to spend as much time as possible practicing, allowing younger students to practice and letting team members practice past 9 p.m.

"Not one high schooler goes to bed at 9 p.m.," said former Cornjerker Brennan Crose, who played under Colston, graduated in 2014 and went on to play college ball.

Defending Colston's other policies, Crose asked, since the state has limits on how much time athletes can practice, "Why put more limits on the program than the state does?"

Crose said middle school student Ben Brown was kicked out of the gym while trying to practice, which is "clearly stating we do not want him to be successful.
