All Grant precincts' voting to be at St. Anthony Parish Hall

Hoopeston's newest one stop shop for voting will get its first trial Tuesday.

Voters in Grant 1-6 will all cast ballots at St. Anthony Parish Hall, 313 E. Lincoln, Hoopeston.

The parish hall, along with other polling places, was eliminated

when Vermilion County Clerk Cathy Jenkins combined voting in one location in one location in time for the March 2016 primary. In March and the 2016 presidential election, voters converged on McFerren Park Civic Center to cast ballots.



moved to the parish hall.

While better-suited for those with handicaps, parking may still be an issue as Maple School staff use the parking lot on school days. In making the announcement last July, Jenkins said she would work with St. Anthony's in dealing with the concern.

Voters Tuesday will select party candidates who will face off in the November general election. Democrats have six gubernatorial hopefuls while on the Republican side, incumbent Bruce Rauner is being challenged by Jeanne Ives.

With Attorney General Lisa Madigan's decision to not run again, it's a wide open field with two Republicans and seven Democrat candidates.

County Republicans are running unopposed at the county and local level but Democrats have two candidates running to face Jenkins in November.

The biggest local issue of interest is the request from Vermilion County schools for taxpayers to implement a one percent school facilities sales tax. If passed, the tax will provide funds for capital improvements for such things as new buildings, safety improvements and technology upgrades. Money may also be used to pay off building-related bond issues and to lower property taxes.
