Mayor, Brockus hope to partner on city problems, projects

A partnership between Hoopeston officials and Hoopeston Retirement Village Foundation has been suggested to help alleviate problems and move projects along to completion.

A meeting between the council, as a committee of the whole, and Brockus, a member of Hoopeston Retirement Village Foundation, was held March 14 to discuss blighted properties.

Five aldermen - Chad Yaden, Bill McElhaney, Lourdine Florek, Alex Houmes and Bill Goodwine. along with Mayor Bill Crusinberry - discussed the issue with Brockus and heard comments from residents.

Brockus outlined some of the existing problems: down-

town buildings with falling facades, roofs caving in and other problems; several residential properties in much the same shape; and properties, like the former Vermilion Iron foundry, which will be costly to remove. He said the cost to remove asbestos from the site has been estimated at \$185,000.

Brockus has previously suggested that Hoopeston should market itself as a bedroom community to Danville and other cities, saying that just like many Hoopeston residents travel for their jobs, residents of other communities would prefer a commute to be able to live in a safer community. He reiterated that thought at the meeting.

dition to Macon County. His vehicle was towed from the scene.

Goodwine said officials want to address issues, which also include a \$2.5 million shortfall in the police pension fund, a dwindling population creating a glut of excess homes, but can't do them all.

Brockus asked if Goodwine had no confidence in the economic development plan.

"We need jobs," Goodwine retorted. "Danville has its own employment problems."

"There's not going to be another FMC," Brockus countered, saying Hoopeston has to look at "who we are today and who we want to be."

Crusinberry said the city has to "dig deep in our pockets and start cleaning things up. I think we need to find a way."

On top of blighted properties and the issues Goodwine listed there is also the problem of flooding on the northeast side and other issues. "It seems like there's no individual or group that can tackle it," he said

However, he said, the city "has the power to finance all of this" through a bond issue.

Bonds - debt securities - could be issue to raise money to fund the projects. The bond issue would be repaid with tax dollars, either through money already collected by the

city or by a tax implemented for repayment of the bonds.

As an example, Brockus said the payment on a \$1 million bond would be \$7,200 a month, a cost that could be shared with others. "I'm confident I can raise 50 percent of the monthly payment just from the people I talked to today," he said.

The meeting with the city was not the only time Brockus has raised the possibility of a bond issue. In an interview with Just the Facts in January, he said he would have to approach the city about a multi-million dollar bond issue to continue HRVF's economic development work because foundation funds are being drained and the foundation cannot implement a bond issue.
