Danville voters drive failure of school facilities sales tax

A 28 "yes" vote lead by county residents for a school facilities tax was wiped out by 667 "no" votes from Danville voters in Tuesday's primary election.

A referendum asking voters to approve a one percent school facilities tax fell by 639 votes, 5,103 to 4,464, according to unofficial results from Vermilion County and Danville election authorities.

Locally, the measure passed in Grant 4 by 13 votes and Ross 2 by 16. It failed in Grant 1,2,3,5 and 6, as

well as Ross 1, South Ross and Butler.

Had the measure passed, it would have provided new revenue to Vermilion County schools from a one percent sales tax on things like household items, dining out and gas. Food, drugs, licensed vehicles and farm implements and inputs were excluded.

Hoopeston Area officials estimated the tax would have generated \$436,000 for the district.

Opponents of the proposal suggested the district find ways to trim expenses - in November, district auditor Russ Leigh said Hoopeston's total per-pupil cost is more than \$11,000. Critics also cited a lack of transparency by officials on current spending.

The issue was defeated but may not be dead as a second try in November has not been ruled out, according to reports.

In state races, local residents voted with the majority of other Illinoisans in most cases, but in the Democrat race for governor, Chris Kennedy took Ross 2 with six votes, and Butler with nine.

JB Pritzker will be the Democrat nominee in November, facing incumbent Bruce Rauner, who defeated Jeanne Ives at the state and local levels.

Pat Quinn will be the Democrat nominee for attorney general and he led the eight-candidate field in all local precincts except Ross 1, where Kwame Raoul won with 8 votes.

On the Republican side, former Miss America Erika Harold won the state and local races over challenger Gary Grasso.
