# Council approves stricter street corner, peddler ordinances

Those collecting for charitable causes and peddlers selling their wares will have stricter rules in Hoopeston after aldermen approved new ordinances at Tuesday evening's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Groups that solicit funds through street corner collections must now register with the city at least 10 days before the date of the collection, must fill out a registration form and must appear before Hoopeston City Council to ask permission to solicit under the ordinance that passed 5 -3. Mayor Bill Crusinberry joined aldermen Bill McElhaney, Ryan Anderson, Bill Goodwine and Brandon Hamilton in voting for and Chad Yaden, Alex Houmes and Lourdine Florek voting against.

Groups that wish to solicit must pay a nonrefundable \$30 deposit at least two days before the event, payable after council approval has been given. The fee includes use of high-visibility vests which will be provided by the

State law governs part of the ordinance, mandating that organizations must be registered with the Illinois Attorney General as a charitable organization; will be liable for injuries to people or property during hours of solicitation; and will not allow anyone under 16 to solicit.

The new ordinance also allows the mayor, police chief or his designee to shut down collections due to inclement weather.

Collections will be allowed from 7 a.m.-3 p.m. on the intersection of Rtes. 1 and 9, Market and Penn and Market and Main only. Groups soliciting must have signage stating the name of the organization collecting and purpose of the collection.

No soliciting will be allowed on Sundays or national holidays.

McElhaney, civic improvement committee chairman, said the ordinance is necessary to keep street corner collectors safe.

His original proposal limited collections from 7 a.m.-1 p.m., but Ald. Bill Goodwine, who does collections for St. Anthony youth group's summer work camp, said "quite a lot of money can be raised between 1 and 3. After 3, it's kind of worthless," prompting McElhaney to extend the time.

Yaden said he did corner collections for Lions Club Candy Day many years ago and saw a collector nearly hit by a semi at Rtes. 1 and 9. "My question is, is somebody's life worth a jug of money," he asked.

Florek questioned why the council was voting on ordinances received that day and also if the ordinance needed to apply to downtown collections since the statute differentiated between "roadway" and "highway."

After the meeting, Houmes said "I support and am willing to contribute to many charitable organizations, but not by way of street corner collections."

As for representatives of companies that go door-todoor unsolicited, their cost of doing business in Hoopeston went up under the updated peddlers and itinerant merchants ordinance.

New regulations include completing an application with a nonrefundable \$60 fee per solicitor; refundable

\$500 deposit per solicitor; a \$50 per-day license fee; providing photo identification and other information; submitting to a background check; and an appearance before the city council to request permission.

Exempted from the regulations are farmers selling produce and veterans and other charitable organizations, who must register with the city and also be registered with the attorney general's office, McElhaney said.

Solicitors are expected to carry \$100,000/\$300,000 of insurance per person/occurrence, respectively.

Residents who do not wish to have solicitors come to their homes are asked to put "No Solicitors" or "Charitable Solicitors Only" signs in their windows.

Solicitors who then com to those homes to solicit may be charged with violating the ordinance and face a \$500 fine for the first offense and \$750 for a second
