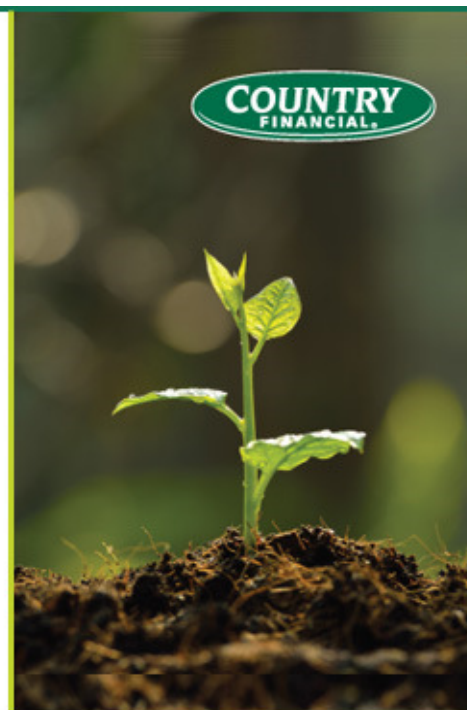

when to use it. Other survival skills will also be taught.

- Carl Ankenbrand will teach Pirate Printing to kids in grades 5-8 during the June session and digital photography to youngsters in grades 5-8 during the July session.
- Kelly Ankenbrand will teach Internet Safety for grades 3-5 in June.
- Suzanne Boyer will instruct "Fitness: Time to Move It!!", "Create & Recycle, and Greeting Cards" and "Work Hard - Play Hard" in July. June sessions of the classes have been canceled.
- "Money-makers," "Native American History, Crafts and Web Sites," and "Really Good Guys and Really Bad Guys" will all be taught by Kari Rayls for both sessions.
- Sara Anderson will host "Around the World," for the June session.

Participants will be treated to a free movie at 10 a.m. June 30 and July 28 at the Little Lorraine Theatre.

Individual classes are \$50 each. A full day option is available for \$150 per week and includes lunch, or students may bring their own.
