Hoopeston Area FFA returns from convention with awards

SPRINGFIELD—Members of the Hoopeston Area FFA chapter attended the 90th annual Illinois State FFA Convention June 12-14, along with more than 5,000 other FFA members, advisors, and guests.

"Be Bold" was the theme of the three-day event which recognizes achievements of Illinois FFA members, elects the major state officer team, and celebrates agriculture. Students at the convention were greeted with activities including a career fair featuring colleges and agribusinesses, an evening dance and talent show, and an opportunity to engage in the history of Illinois' capital city.

The convention's 2018 service project benefitted children through Cravon Initiative," which collects old, used crayons and creates new ones for distribution to art programs at children's hospitals across the nation.

The convention program featured addresses by National FFA Southern Re-Bennett of Georgia and

In recent years we have seen CVS invest big money into a new facility at the intersection of Rt. 1 & 9. Gibson City Hospital has developed a large medical services office next door. Casey's built two locations to serve Hoopeston. McDonald's purchased land and built a beautiful new restaurant on the corner. IGA has underwent a very involved expansion. A Mexican restaurant has opened where CVS once sat in the shopping center.

Just to the west of the intersection, Cox Memorials has been established. To the north, Dollar General put up a new building and moved from downtown. Anthem Chevrolet underwent a major face-lift to enhance the appearance of their dealership. Molly Culbert's underwent revamping and a large build-on to become Treasured Roots. Do It Best Hardware put up a new building to expand their lumber supplies. Across the street is the newly constructed nursing home.

South of Market Street and Rt. 9, Autumn Fields developed a large senior citizen complex. Behind this location, a large subdivision was established and now additional houses are being built behind Casey's.

What do all these activities have in common? They

were dreamed up and accomplished by individuals with private money to invest. They did not depend on city taxpayers to pay for their dreams or to insure their success.

We should not be thinking about putting up three million dollars we don't have to finance the dreams of a truck stop, motel, restaurant or whatever else may come to mind. This should be the responsibility of those who dream up the plans.

After being committed to a \$9 per month dispatch fee that we did not have a choice on, we must make it clear to our aldermen that we do not want additional financial burdens hanging over our head.

It would seem that such a major obligation should be put to a vote by the people being effected. If not, we must be strong and steady in letting our city council know how we feel about this long term risky undertaking.
