## Planning commission recommends Lincoln Street closure

A proposal to close West Lincoln Street received unanimous approval from the Hoopeston Planning/Zoning Commission Monday.

That approval did not come easily, as members of the commission and the public peppered representatives of Teasdale Foods with questions and concerns.

Mel Lollar, plant manager, said the project will allow for safety for forklift operators driving between buildings, warehousing space and much-needed loading docks, as well as overall business growth but residents and some commission members focused on illegal truck traffic on Lincoln; possible alternative traffic routes, especially in emergency situations; how closure would affect emergency services; and the inconvenience of closing the street.

On the company side, Lollar outlined the history of the plant, which Teasdale purchased in 2012 from Hoopeston Foods. He showed plant growth in cases, from 3,548,000 in 2008 to a projected 7,145,721 this year, an increase of 201 percent.

Teasdale has seen 210 percent growth in pounds of beans and corn, going from 85, 918,095 in 2008 to an estimated 180,533,521 this year.

Hiring has also increased, from a total 153 employees in 2013 to 215 this year. Numbers include administrators, members of the Teamsters and Bakery, Confectionery, Tobacco Workers and Grain Millers unions and temporary employees.

Teasdale has also invested in the plant, with \$2,777,909 expected to be spent on capital improvements this year and a five-year total of \$6,501,909.

This year's upgrades include rebuilding hydrostatic cookers to increase their longevity, at a cost of \$619,000; \$1.4 million for a new Knapp tray line; \$525,565 for a Knapp bundler and \$225,000 for a color sorter.

After Lollar's presentation, commissioners questioned him about the proposal. Commissioner Jeff Wise asked if a traffic study had been done. "We didn't do one," Lollar answered, adding Teasdale sent letters to neighbors on Lincoln and received only one negative response.

In discussing truck drivers who illegally use Lincoln to get to the plant, commission Chairman Jim Richards suggested GPS directions as the reason. When the rail crossing was closed for several weeks, GPS still showed Lincoln as the way to get to Teasdale, causing trucks to have to back up or make sharp turns to get out of the area. "That's the one thing that has to be fixed one way or the other," he said.

Drivers who call the plant are told to use Second Ave., Richards added.

Both sides discussed possible signage on Rt. 9, directing drivers to not turn on Lincoln, but Wise minimized the benefit. "It won't make any difference. People won't pay attention," he said.

Paul and Angie Kelnhofer, owners of Paul's Auto and Truck Repair's, own a storage facility for towed vehicles close to the railroad tracks, are not in favor of the closure and asked several questions about the impact action would have on children walking to Maple School and whether the school was notified; whether anyone considered the impact to other businesses in the area; what had been done to adjust the flow of semis currently going down Lincoln; and others.

Apolinar Solis Jr., and Kellie Ferrell, who both live in

the area, expressed concern about the danger semis pose, especially to children. Solis spoke of trucks getting backed up in the area and causing damage as drivers tried to manipulate them and how, since there is no alley next to the tracks, semi drivers would take their trucks over open lots to get to their destination.

"I used to live in where you live 30 years ago," Wise said. "I know exactly what you're talking about."

As discussion wound down, Richards said he sympathized with concerns about safety but said there was an economic component that also needed to be considered - that keeping an employer in Hoopeston was important, a sentiment echoed by fellow Commissioner Charlene Ervin. In the end, the aforementioned commissioners, along with Bill Boose and Shawn Swartzentruber, voted to recommend the closure.

After the meeting, Wise said he voted in favor solely for the benefit it would bring to Hoopeston, "No ifs and or buts."

Moore, who said he came with no preconceived ideas, said some issues needed to be addressed and that he takes his role a commissioner seriously.

Commissioners indicated they would like the company and Hoopeston to work to alleviate some issues brought up by residents.

In 2017, company officials requested the street be vacated from First Ave. to the railroad tracks to allow Teasdale to connect warehouses on each side of the street. In making the request, officials cited safety concerns for forklift drivers traveling between warehouses; a need for more parking for an expanded workforce; and a new loading dock to handle increased truck traffic.
