Welch named new sergeant for Hoopeston Police Department

A long-time Hoopeston Police officer has been promoted to sergeant.

Jeremy Welch's promotion to sergeant was announced Sunday in a press release from Hoopeston Police Commission.

Welch has been with the department for 19 years and is one of three HPD officers who took the test to become sergeant.

All passed the test but one withdrew his name before candidate interviews, said Commissioner Michl Kearney.

After completing interviews, the commission recommended Welch to Chief Jim DeWitt, who accepted the recommendation.

Welch will command second shift and will be in charge of departmental training.

DeWitt was second shift sergeant prior to being named chief in April.

Along with Kearney, other commissioners are Danny Danner and Robin Lawson.

Former Hoopeston man murdered early Friday in Chicago

A former Hoopeston man was murdered Friday in Chicago, one of eight people killed in a 12-hour period.

Justin A. Kapoor, 27, of Shorewood, was found in his 2016 white Ford Fusion near the parking lot of Mt. Carmel Missionary Baptist Church in the Bronzeville neighborhood on the city's south side.

According to printed reports, witnesses said Mr. Kapoor, a 2009 graduate of Hoopeston Area High School, argued with someone who pulled out a gun and shot him once in the arm and twice in the head at about 4:50 a.m. He was taken to University of Chicago Medical Center,

where he was pronounced dead at 7:20 a.m.

Mr. Kapoor spent part of his life living with his aunt and uncle, Cathy and Gary Brown, of Hoopeston, and Mrs. Brown's daughters, Cherri Abbed Saltijeral, now of North Aurora and Michele Abbed Petty, of Shorewood.

After Mrs. Brown's death in 2016, he moved from Danville, where he lived after graduating, and for a time lived with each of his cousins before moving to and working in the Chicago area.

Charged with disobeying police, she was released on a notice to appear in Hoopeston City Court.

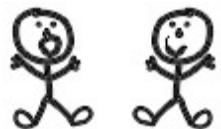

ing for Lyft, a ride share program and may have parked to rest for a bit between passengers.

Mr. Kapoor had driven for the company part time and went full time in February, Saltijeral said. He would drive all over Chicago and suburbs, "just going where the work was," she said. "He loved his car and he loved to drive."

Because Mr. Kapoor's license listed his address as Shorewood, police from the village went to

Petty's home to ask if she knew Mr. Kapoor and to ask her to call the lead detective. Police have had no contact with family members since then, Saltijeral said.

No arrests had been made as of Monday evening.

Family memories of Mr. Kapoor revolve around family and love. Saltijeral said her best memory of Mr. Kapoor is how he loved her mom. For Petty, it's how much Mr. Kapoor enjoyed playing video games with her three sons, and how much they enjoyed it, too.

He is also remembered as a caring friend. Learning of his death, Mr. Kapoor's closest friends, Caleb Thrasher and Bryton Goodrum, sent the photograph (above), which family and friends are posting on Facebook in his memory.

Whatever the investigation turns up, Saltijeral is sure what it won't. "He was definitely not into drugs or gangs," she said. "This was him being in the wrong place at the wrong time."
