Early morning hacking awakens HA families to fake news

Hoopeston Area parents are asking how much personal information was stolen in an early morning computer hack Monday.

The hack began at about 3:15 a.m. Many teachers reported receiving one message but families on the district's instant notification system reported receiving as many as 20 notifications. Purportedly from district officials, topics ranged from school being closed this week to reelecting

the Hoopeston Area School District website was hacked with pictures and repeated emergency callout messages to district families. The website is now secured and the website address of the person(s) causing the disruption is being investigated. Superintendent Suzzette Hesser said, "I apologize for the inconvenience this breach has caused our families, staff, and community.

We are working to ensure that this disruption will not happen again and that the person(s) involved are held Police allege Gillispie was in possession of the stolen items and charged with burglary. He was taken to the Public Safety Building in Danville to await arraignment.

The event is leaving families wondering how the hacking happened. Some have wondered whether it is related to the district's new website and whether Apptegy, the company that did it and several other county schools' websites, have stringent enough security in place.
