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

### Steak dinner to support downtown improvement program

Area residents can sink their teeth into a steak and help support a downtown improvement program.

The Lorraine Foundation plans to acquire two more downtown properties in their continuing effort to improve downtown.

A former gas station at 402 E. Main, across Third St. from the Lorraine Theatre and an empty building on Market, across from the Willdon Building will be purchased from tax trustees for \$750 each, said Alex Houmes, Lorraine Foundation vice president.


The gas station has been declared a nuisance property. Lorraine officials hope to repair the original garage, if salvageable, to use for storage and demolish the remaining property. Work is estimated to cost \$8,000. The Market St. building has been condemned by the city and will be razed and replaced with a visual green space, at a cost of \$4.200.

To help fund the work, Lorraine Foundation is holding a steak dinner benefit from 5-8 p.m. Saturday at Mr. B's Café, 307 E. Main. Cost is \$25 per plate and includes steak, baked potato, roll, salad and dessert. Patrons may dine in or carry out their order by calling (217) 283-8888.

The foundation also has taken ownership of the former city hall building at Market and Penn and is raising funds to secure it. Lorraine Foundation also owns its flagship structures, the Lorraine Theatre and the Willdon Building along with the Little Lorraine Theatre.
