Improvements at McFerren Park, water department listed

Aldermen learned of improvements at McFerren Park and approved an improvement for the water department at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Ald. Alex Houmes, parks committee chairman, said a list of winter tasks is being drawn up. Topping the list is trimming or removing trees in the park.

Thirty trees have been identified for trimming or removal, Houmes said, adding the goal is to attend to a minimum of 10 of them this year. Trees not near buildings can be felled quickly, with more care used on those near park structures, he said.

Houmes also announced he has met with representatives of the local Girl Scouts about improving the city-owned Girl Scout House in the park.

Scouts plan to hold fundraisers to help pay for improvements, the first of which is painting the exterior. Houmes said scout representatives wanted to paint it in colors representative of the Girl Scouts, but that since the building is also rented by local residents, neutral colors will be chosen.

Other items on the fix-it list include patching a large crack by the fireplace inside and replacing tables and chairs.

Aldermen also approved, 8-0, a measure to improve temperature control at the water plant. Ald. Lourdine

Florek, water/sewer committee chair, said the existing cooling system is failing to keep humidity down and condensation has been forming on pipes above the electronics used to regulate the water system.

Florek said she considered the situation an emergency and made a motion that bids be waived, which was approved 8-0.

The council then approved spending not more than \$15,000 on the project, based on an estimate from Cade's Heating and Air for \$12,588.

In unrelated business, the council:

- Heard from Ald. Chad Yaden that the new mower is in service. He also mentioned two businesses recently opened: a vape shop on Rt. 1 across near Casey's on Penn. and Kimberly's Tan at 227 S. Market.

- Mayor Bill Crusinberry said he started getting calls from the vape shop about six months ago regarding city regulations. The city has no ordinances regulating vape shops, so Crusinberry said he referred them to state laws.

- Heard a proclamation submitted by Barbara Standish Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution and read by Crusinberry marking Sept. 17-23 as Constitution Week. This is the 231st anniversary of the drafting of the Constitution.

Groups to hold free household hazardous waste collection

A free household hazardous waste collection for Vermilion County residents will be held from 8 a.m.-3 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 29 at Danville Area Community College, 2000 E. Main St., Danville.

The collection will accept oil based paints, used motor oil, old gasoline, expired or unwanted medicine, fluorescent lamp bulbs, pool chemicals, pesticides, mercury, antifreeze, lawn chemicals, drain cleaners, household batteries, cleaning products and herbicides.

Residents are asked to not bring latex paint because it is not hazardous and can be safely dried or ab-

sorbed and discarded with regular trash.

Items that will not be accepted include TVs and computer monitors, fire extinguishers, explosives and fireworks, business or commercial waste, propane tanks and other pressurized fuel and gas tanks, controlled substances, smoke detectors, agriculture chemicals, medical sharps or other medical waste.
