Rossville Methodist Church to celebrate 150th anniversary

Rossville's first Methodist organization, (1868) held services in the newly-completed school house after they overflowed the Gilbert home and the Henderson building and began construction in June 1869 on a new church.

They dedicated their fine brick church July 17, 1870. This was enlarged about 1890. They outgrew it, and the present building, at 116 Maple St., was dedicated February 28, 1904.

To serve the growing membership and increased activities, a new addition was built and dedicated May 14, 1949 and named the "Fellowship Hall". The last addition has been a new drive up back entrance, new restrooms, and handicapped accessible entrance to the main level of the church. This was built in 2002. The church has grown as needed to serve their congregation.

We are proud to be part of the great Rossville community and are celebrating our 150 years of service. We would like to invite the community in celebrating with us on Sunday September 30. Please come spend the whole day with us or part of it. We will have church at 9 a.m. At noon, a potluck dinner will be held, with meat, drink and table service provided. Please come join us.

Football

Twenty points is enough to win many football contests, but for the Hoopeston Area co-op team, it wasn't enough Friday night.

The Cornjerkers lost, 40-20, to Georgetown-Ridge Farm at Schlarmann Academy, the Buffaloes' first VVC win this season.

Jacob Catron had two TDs in two of five receptions during the game. Junior Vaughn Black scored the team's other touchdown, along with a two point conversion.

In game stats, quarterback Marcus Blurton was 10 of 18 for a total 118 yards passing. Catron was often on the receiving end of the pigskin, with 92 yards.

Senior Jordan Mance led in rushing with 22 yards in three carries.

Jacob Selsor led the team in tackles, with seven, followed by Catron with five. Charles Landers had one sack.

On defense, HASAAP had four fumble recoveries during the game, with Catron claiming two and Elijah Venecia and Kameron Cappellano each nabbing one.

Venecia had had one interception for the game.

Catron garnered 250 yards with seven punts during the game while junior Isaiah Debban led in kickoff returns with two for 31 yards.

The Cornjerkers are now 0-3 in the Vermilion Valley Conference and 1-4 overall. The team travels to Westville for a 7 p.m. contest Friday.

Cornjerker soccer improved its record to 10-0-1 after a 3-2 win over Bismarck-Henning/Rossville-Alvin on September 18.

In the first half, with 34:49 on the clock, Carson Alwardt scored the opening goal with an assist from Lucas Hofer. With 2:26 left, BHRA's Drew Reifsteck scored, assisted by Cameron Douglas, on a throw-in.

The Reifsteck/Douglas team put the Blue Devils in the lead in the second half, scoring on a corner kick at 29:42.

Rhys Root, assisted by Ethan Smith, scored at 15:12, creating a tie that was broken with 4:10 left on a header goal by Hofer, assisted by Smith, on a throw-in.

In JV action, HAHS won 5-0.

On Thursday, the Cornjerkers hosted Georgetown-Ridge Farm/Westville, defeating the visitors 3-0, in a match that saw scoring only in the first half.

Rhys Root scored at 33:28, with an assist from Brennen Granados on through ball, followed at 26:55 when Cameron Flint scored on a great pass from Ethan Smith. The final score came with 5:25 left
