Hoopeston Post Office marks 100 years in current building

Tucked away in various nooks and crannies of the Hoopeston Post Office are treasurers from days gone by: weighty metal badges that identified city carriers by route number, sturdy delivery bags, still in good shape, although unused in years; a pushcart used to transport mail to and from the post office and rail depot.

Some of those items will be on display this week as Hoopeston Post Office marks its 100th anniversary on October 5.

Postmaster Julie McCrory said a customer appreciation day will be held from 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m. Friday. Snacks and refreshments will be served and residents can view postal memorabilia from bygone years, as well as photographs taken during the construction phase of the present post office, at 314 S. Market.

The present post office opened for business on October 5, 1918, but Hoopeston had mail service since 1871, the year the city was founded.

The post office was established October 25, 1871, with the first regular mail received December 9. Mail brought to Hoopeston by train began January 1, 1872.

Postal services were offered in a few locations early on, including the storeroom of Lukens and Mullin, at the corner of Main and Bank. In 1872, it moved one door west of Lukens and Mullin.

In 1873, then-Postmaster James M.R. Spinning leased the first floor of the Chronicle building, then at Main and

In the early days of postal service, residents went to the post office to get mail and take care of other business. During its history, Hoopeston's various post offices have served not only to dispense and receive mail but also as a gather point for residents to catch up with each other and also do a little shopping for newspapers, and periodicals, along with school supplies and cigars. According to printed reports, Postmaster Spinning, who received a \$12 per year salary, operated a store, of sorts, from the post office.

In 1872, it was reported in the North Vermilion Chronicle that the money order system was needed very much but that the local office did not generate enough revenue to allow it. Permission was granted in July 1873.

Rural delivery was done by horse As part of the special day, customers of the celebration marking Hooneston and buggy and collection boxes were placed in outlying areas allowing rural residents to deposit outgoing mail. In

about 1903, that changed. City delivery began and nearly all rural collection boxes were brought into the city for use at collection points around Hoopeston.

Money for the existing post office was appropriated by Congress in 1910, after ex-postmaster William Finley, and Charles Warner, along with other residents, lobbied "Uncle Joe" Cannon, who represented the 18th Congressional district. Due to various delays, funding was unavailable until 1917, when construction was started. The federal building cost \$10,000 to erect and furnish.

Newspapers at the time of the building's opening called attention to its attractiveness and fireproof quality and the spaciousness of the grounds, which drew compliments from visitors of the day.


