



Hoopeston natives named among publication's 40 Under 40

Two Hoopeston natives are among those named to Central Illinois Business Magazine's 40 Under 40 for 2018.

Alex Houmes, 26, of Hoopeston, and former resident, 34-year-old Lyndsay Howell were honored at a luncheon Thursday at the Hilton Garden Inn.

The awards are presented by the magazine, published by News-Gazette Media.

Houmes, son of Eric and Kim Houmes, is forecasting and planning supervisor at Watchfire Signs in Danville. A Ward 3 alderman, he is also vice president of the Lorraine Foundation, which operates and is restoring the Historic Lorraine Theatre, as well as other downtown buildings.

In biographical information for the award, Houmes said his proudest professional accomplishment is saving and reutilizing the Willdon Building, Hoopeston's largest downtown building, which had sat vacant or 15 year. Under the umbrella of the Lorraine Foundation, and with help from Vermilion County Land Bank, Houmes was able to acquire the 110-year-old structure to use for business space. Six months after taking possession of the Willdon, the doors were

opened and now house four businesses, with the potential for many more.

Houmes attributes his success to "the work ethic, drive and attention to detail instilled in me by my parents."
