City council approves extending TIF duration for 12 years

In a 7-0 vote, Hoopeston City Council on Tuesday approved a resolution to extend the life of its tax increment financing (TIF) districts.

Ald. Bill Goodwine, finance committee chairman, who oversees the city's TIF program, gave a brief history of TIF and explained how it works.

TIF 1 was created in 2000, with TIF 2 following five years later. By statute, TIF districts last 23 years, with Hoopeston's set to expire in 2023 and 2028. The legislature approved a one-time, 12-year extension of the program, which Hoopeston officials hope to receive.

With its own approval, and that of most other taxing bodies, Hoopeston's request will be sent to state Rep.

Tom Bennett to present for approval.

Using the CVS site as an example, Goodwine said the equalized assessed valuation of the property before CVS was built was \$86,481, called the base. In 2016, the EAV was \$380,425, resulting in an increment of \$32,949.77.

Under TIF, taxing bodies receive their share of property tax on the base EAV but the increment goes to the city. After five percent pays administrative costs, 70 percent of what's left - \$21,911.60 on 2016 taxes- went to First Equity Group, developers of the CVS property, to recoup its TIF eligible expenses.

Hoopeston kept the remaining 30 percent to use for TIFeligible projects in Hoopeston. Historically, each year, a portion is also returned to Hoopeston Area school district to be used for major programs.

Once First Equity Group's redevelopment agreement with Hoopeston expires, the city will receive the entire increment until the TIF expires. When that happens, property taxes will be apportioned among all bodies.

A tool to spur economic development, Goodwine said the short time remaining in the TIF districts is not enticing to developers, who would receive as much back as those who took advantage of TIF in the early years.

Goodwine called TIF a "team effort among taxing bodies," saying other bodies count on Hoopeston to use the See TIF on other side
