Trick-or-treating tips listed in advance of Halloween fun

Ghosts, goblins, ninjas and princesses will be out in force Saturday for trick-or-treating in Hoopeston.

Trick-or-treating will be held from 5:30-7:30 p.m. in the city. Youngsters are asked to go to homes of people they know. Residents who welcome trick-or-treaters are asked to leave their porch lights on.

Other safety tips include: Walk Safely

- •Cross the street at corners. using crosswalks, where available..
- •Look left, right and left again when crossing and keep looking as you cross.
- •Put electronic devices down and keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.
- •Teach children to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
- •Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidecrossings.

•Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach children to never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.
