Filing ends, fields set for school board, municipal elections

With the filing period ending at 5 p.m. Monday, candidates are finalized for the April 2 consolidated election.

The list of candidates for Hoopeston Area school board grew by one after JoHanna Gash, of Wellington, filed at 9:57 a.m. Monday. She and newcomer Rich Eisenmann are vying for one seat representing the area outside of the Congressional township, which housed the original Hoopeston School District.

Chris Elliott of Rankin currently holds that seat.

Four candidates are running for two seats representing the district in the Congressional township. Those seats are currently held by Mark Schaumburg, who did not seek reelection, and Chris Small, who is running for reelection. Other candidates are Lee Cox, Dave McFadden and Connie Catron.

For the Rossville-Alvin district, three incumbents are running for four seats, including Jeremy Deck, Robert Danner and Kyle Zarate.

Incumbent Tim Thornsbrough, of Alvin, did not run again.

In Hoopeston city races, Ward 2 voters will have a choice between newcomers Kellie Ferrell and Jeff Wise. Incumbent Ryan Anderson is not seeking reelection.

In Ward 4, Robin Lawson is challenging long-time incumbent Brandon Hamilton.

Incumbents in Wards 1 and 3 - Chad Yaden and Alex Houmes, respectively - are running unopposed.

In Rossville, three trustee seats are up for reelection. Currently held by Chuck Cornell, Joe Buck and Robert Lusk, only Cornell and Lusk filed to keep their seats. Newcomer Justin Richison has also filed.
