## County NRCS, SWCS open despite government shutdown

Despite the federal government shutdown, local agencies are open to help farmers meet the January 15 signup for the Market Facilitation Program.

The shutdown began at midnight December 22. Many farm agencies shut down immediately on emergency furlough. As of December 28, all Farm Service Agency locations went on furlough due to the lack of funding for the agency. This affects many farmers, especially since FSA started making the first round of MFP payments.


Although FSA is closed, the National Resource Conservation Service office still has funding and is open. The Danville NRCS field office and Vermilion County Soil & Water Conservation Service are open at 1905 U.S. Route 150, Danville.

MFP forms are at the office, which is able to accept completed forms from farmers who would like to turn them in. The office is open 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Monday-Friday.

According to AgDaily, NRCS staff will "accept the application, date stamp and hold until the FSA staff returns to the office."

MFP payments have been put on hold during the shutdown.

Producers who have not started the application process will be directed by NRCS to farmers.gov, where



they can fill out an application with the necessary login information. Applicants without level 2 eAuthorization will have to wait until government funding is restored and FSA offices open.

Ag Secretary Sonny Perdue will determine if the MFP deadline should be extended after appropriations are restored. Producers have until May 1 to certify their production based on their application.

Since NRCS is still open, all contract work should continue, as well. In addition, all partners (state, district, shared employees, etc.) in the NRCS office will be open for business as usual, as well.
