## Council approves policy on involvement in personal tributes

A resolution to establish a policy for signs and private tributes and recognition was unanimously approved by a short-staffed Hoopeston City Council Tuesday night.

Alderman Bill Goodwine raised the issue at the December 18, 2018 meeting, saying taxpayer money should not be used for such things. He suggested a policy and asked the council to consider it.

At Tuesday's meeting, Goodwine, along with Bill McElhaney, Brandon Hamilton and Lourdine Florek and Mayor Bill Crusinberry approved the policy, which states, "It will be the policy of the City of Hoopeston that the city will spend no taxpayer dollars and in general be uninvolved in sponsoring non-city government tributes, recognitions and the like."

Aldermen Chad Yaden, Carl Ankenbrand, Ryan Anderson and Alex Houmes were absent.

The issue arose after resident Truman Page requested signs honoring his son's accomplishments as an umpire.

In researching the request, officials learned such signs may be posted on a state right-of-way for one year only. After the year, the signs may be relocated off the right-ofway.

The cost of the sign is slightly more than \$400, which will be paid by Page.

McElhaney suggested the information gathered in the research be made available to others who are interested in



the state's sign program. Florek suggested the information be placed on the city's webpage.

In other business, Crusinberry he is leading a fund drive to raise money for Hoopeston fireworks this year.

He outlined the history of fireworks in Hoopeston, first overseen by Hoopeston American Legion, followed by the Chamber of Commerce, then car dealerships, then Carle Foundation and Hoopeston Retirement Village Foundation.

Carle is still on board with its \$25,000 donation towards the \$40,000 total, but HRVF has decided to use its funds for other purposes, Crusinberry said.

Crusinberry said he is doing the fundraising as a resident and not as mayor, and is doing so "to maintain the quality of the display." After some comments about last year's fireworks being paired with a tractor pull at the end of July, Crusinberry said this year's show will be held on July 3.

In other discussion:

Crusinberry said the street sweeper needs several repairs, estimated at about \$12,000. Because the work is specialized, bids will be waived and repairs made as soon as possible. The sweeper was purchased new in 2008.
Heard from Hamilton that city animal ordinances will be dovetailed with county ordinances and state statutes in the near future.
