Board candidates square off at HEA-sponsored forum

At Wednesday evening's Candidate's Forum, sponsored by Hoopeston Education Association, Dylan Swank, HEA president, called the April 2 election "momentous."

Many of the six people running for three board seats agreed with that assessment.

Two candidates - JoHanna Gash and Rich Eisenmann are running for one seat representing the area outside the congressional township. Inside the township, four candidates are running for two seats. Candidates are Connie Catron, Lee Cox. Dave McFadden and incumbent Chris Small.

Each candidate was allowed to make opening and closing statements and in between, responded to five questions asked by moderator Rich Stipp:

What makes you a qualified candidate?

What is the role of the superintendent, the board and staff?

With a 70 percent teacher retention rate, and a teacher shortage, how does Hoopeston Area attract and retain teachers?

What are the districts' financial weaknesses?

How would you build relationships between the board and staff and the district and the community?

Defining the superintendent's role, many looked ahead to what qualities are needed in the next superintendent.

Cox knows exactly what he wants. "To me, if you look up 'superintendent' in the dictionary, it's Don Dean," he said, drawing loud applause. Dean knew the students, the sports and "was a financial wizard."



Small said hiring a good superintendent "is not easy," but is "one of the most important things we can do for the community." The superintendent provides "leadership, leadership, leadership." That person also oversees day-to-day operations of the district and is a mentor for not only teachers, but also students and the community, he said.

A cultural shift and resulting problems was something some candidates stressed in response to the questions.

Gash said she was a qualified candidate because she would work to bring respect and honor back to schools, where some students don't respect teachers, some teachers don't respect students or parents, and parents don't respect teachers. Children are not born with characteristics such as honesty, respect and integrity and all sides must work together to install those traits.

With a teacher shortage, hiring is "becoming an employee's market," McFadden said. To get and keep good teachers, the district must change the culture problem in

the buildings, where teachers feel fearful of students. "There's a belief that we're soft on discipline," he said. "When we don't discipline properly, we tell our staff we don't have their backs."

Catron called teaching "a hard job," adding kids are not always lovable. Teachers should not have an environment where they're fearful and where "students rule the roost."

In his final statement, Eisenmann stressed the need for children to learn life lessons. Of his own five, "I want them to win; I want them to learn to compete. I want them to learn how not to win. Real life is realizing not every day is happy. Real achievement should be recognized and celebrated."
