Council approves prep work for development at Rtes. 1, 9

City officials approved starting preparation work to upgrade water and sewer lines for planned development at the corner Rtes. 1 and 9.
 Hoopeston City Council, in a 6-0 vote Tuesday night, approved a \$21,400 contract with Donohue & Associates Engineering of Champaign, to do preparatory work that will extend water and sanitary sewer lines to the site of a planned truck stop.
 The contract calls for Donohue to provide a topographic survey, design, construction plans and specifications to extend the lines to property, said Donohue engineer Tracy Fullen.
 Under the contract, Donohue will also obtain necessary permits from state agencies, including Illinois

Department of Transportation, Environmental Protection Agency, Historic Preservation Agency and Department of Natural Resources, said Ald. Lourdine Florek, water/sewer committee chairman.
 Although final documents for the truck stop have not been signed, having the prep work done will make the project move more quickly once plans are finalized, said Mayor Bill Crusinberry.
 Fullen said the work could begin almost immediately on the survey, which will be followed by the design. Donohue will submit plans for permits to state agencies within 60 days of the contract's approval.
 The \$21,400 will be paid from the \$165,000 ear-

Illinois law allows elected officials to hold a liquor license as long as they are not a law-enforcing public official and do not participate in meetings, hearings, or decisions on matters impacting the manufacture, sale, or distribution of alcoholic liquor.

The issue was raised a few months ago when Robin Lawson, newly elected to represent Ward 4, decided to seek the office. She and her husband, Brian, plan to open a steak house downtown and plan to serve alcohol but have not yet applied for a liquor license.

Under current ordinance, Lawson would have had to choose between serving on the council or serving alcohol in the steak house.

The council also unanimously approved the 2019-20 budget, which starts with income of \$3,008,359, which comes from \$489,543 in tax levies and a \$285,000 transfer from the utility tax. Expenses include \$2,599,161 for all city departments and \$270,840 for accrual funds for major purchases such as vehicles.

An additional \$68,350 will go for one-time expenses. Included in this is \$4,350 for new downtown planters, \$2,500 towards July 3 fireworks, \$11,000
